Role Overview

We are looking for a motivated **Carbon Analyst** with a minimum of 3-5 years of relevant work experience to join Earthly's Research Team. The candidate will work alongside the GIS Researcher, Portfolio Lead and Origination Lead developing, consulting, and/or assessing high-integrity carbon projects globally.

Key Responsibilities

• Project development & consulting:

- Feasibility studies: estimates of carbon removal/avoidance potential based on geospatial analysis, preliminary baseline sampling, and literature; protocol & methodology eligibility analysis
- Due diligence & baselining: carbon baseline selection, dynamic baseline estimation, sampling strategy, buffer and leakage deductions, carbon curve modelling following selected carbon methodology
- Registration: Project Description and monitoring report writing following VCS & CCB, PlanVivo and/or other standards. Registration, validation, monitoring, reporting, verification, Registry relations and account management, VVB contracting & management, Corrective Action Request resolution

• Project assessment and sourcing

- Carbon assessments: assessment of both mature and early-stage projects' alignment with most common carbon methodologies (e.g. VM0047, VM0048, VM0033...), quantitative additionality and overissuance screening through independent assessment of carbon projects' claimed baseline and expected carbon impact.
- Sourcing and onboarding: searching, assessing, writing gaps & recommendations reports, writing of technical reports and public-facing project summary pages and identifying the highest quality projects to be onboarded on the earthly portfolio
- Technical support for sales: Filling in RFP questionnaires, responding to third-party due diligence and offtaker/investor's questions



Relevant Candidates will have:

Essential Qualities:

- Masters' degree or PhD in a relevant scientific field such as environmental sciences, physics, environmental engineering, etc.
- 3+ years of relevant work experience, specifically quantitatively modelling carbon impact of Nature-Based solutions.
- Familiarity with at least some of the most common carbon methodologies used in the VCM (e.g. Verra's VM0033, VM0042, VM0047, VM0048; PlanVivo's PM001; CAR's Mexico Forest Protocol, etc)
- Flexibility and agility in critically adapting theoretical academic knowledge to local idiosyncrasies and data, knowledge or time constraints.
- Reliability when working independently under pressure on sensitive tasks, which will determine the success or failure of nature-based projects.
- Clarity and conciseness when writing for both a technical and non-technical audience, adapting the tone to the context and purpose.
- Ability to work collaboratively, empathetically and effectively ask and give feedback, and be aware and transparent about one's limitations, asking for help when needed.

- Experience writing Project Description Documents following one of the most common nature-based carbon methodologies (e.g. Verra's VM0033, VM0042, VM0047, VM0048; PlanVivo's PM001; CAR's Mexico Forest Protocol, etc)
- Experience successfully going through Verra or similar registries' registration process until issuance and beyond.
- Practical experience with successful nature-based project development on the ground
- Familiarity with the Voluntary Carbon Market, its trends and quality frameworks such as ICVCM, CORSIA, etc.
- Knowledge of use cases and limitations of major publicly available remote sensing datasets used to estimate deforestation rates and biomass
- Experience with carbon monitoring and statistical modelling.
