To leverage the power of nature-based solutions to protect and restore >1% of the planet by 2030 (150+ million ha).


Company overview


We are a team of entrepreneurs, engineers and scientists, brought together through a shared passion for both reversing climate breakdown and restoring nature.

We are empowering hundreds of organisations around the world to actively contribute to the protection and restoration of our planet. We do this by identifying the world's most impactful nature-based projects that align with our client's environmental and social goals.




Our impact to date

Our emissions in 2024








Distribution of emissions

- Our reported carbon emissions increased between • 2022 and 2023. This is predominantly due to increasing the accuracy and scope of our spend-based emissions, specifically purchased services.
- Business travel increased as the team grew in size. •
- Commuting, homeworking and other workspace data ٠ based on an employee survey with a 100% response rate. Data for employees that left in 2023 was taken from the 2022 survey.
- Earthly is a fully remote company and all emissions fall ٠ under Scope 3.



New projects welcomed



Sharan Ghai, Research Portfolio Lead

In 2024, we added five new projects focused on woodland restoration, regenerative farming and rainforest conservation. We are working to update our assessment framework to include deeper analysis of biodiversity and social impacts, such as global North vs. South distinctions. Additionally, we conducted a field visit in the Latin American region and are expanding to new registries and methodologies, with a focus on habitats like the Amazon and biomes such as water.

拾 Tree sponsorship – Dumyat, Scotland

The project is restoring woodlands, grasslands, wetlands and meadows to create a biodiverse ecosystem. Beyond conservation, the project boosts the local economy by employing local contractors and collaborating with institutions like the University of Stirling to provide research and training opportunities.



殆 Native woodland restoration - Sofala, Mozambique

The Kukumuty project focuses on restoring approximately 400 hectares of degraded Miombo woodland. The project combines native woodland restoration with the establishment of agroforestry nurseries and systems to reduce commercial pressure on the forest while improving local livelihoods.



New projects welcomed

Regenerative farming - Indo-gangetic plains, India

Spanning seven Indian states, this project engages over 51,000 farmers to transform traditional agricultural practices. By promoting sustainable techniques, the project aims to support smallholder farmers to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, restore degraded land and enhance soil health and crop yields.



😚 Woodland creation – Iford Estate, UK

Across 1,200 hectares of land within the South Downs National Park, this project is reshaping degraded farmland. By restoring historic and native ecosystems, this initiative enhances biodiversity, sequesters carbon and provides essential habitats for over 1,000 species.



殆 Rainforest conservation - Sabah, Malaysia

The project protects 83,381 hectares of tropical forest once designated for commercial logging. The area is now a Class I Forest Reserve that safeguards biodiversity corridors. The project enhances local livelihoods through job creation, improved healthcare, education and clean water access.



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This year at a glance

Mew Earthly badge

We retired our Climate Positive Certification and launched the new Earthly badge. This was a big decision for our business, as many customers appreciated having a label to put to their sustainability action. However, to avoid greenwashing and conflict with regulations, it's crucial that businesses avoid any kind of vague or misleading green claims. Our customers are proudly sharing an Earthly badge to highlight their work with us, and linking to their impact dashboards.

😻 Biodiversity credits

We launched a new way for businesses to connect to nature and fund UK biodiversity: Voluntary Biodiversity Credits. With DEFRA biodiversity net gain units as our starting point, we were able to create one of the first biodiversity credit systems, available for all organisations to purchase. The credits represent 3×3m² parcels of land, managed and improved for biodiversity, for 30 years.

😂 Partnerships

This year we made progress by partnering with international organisations who want to bring high-integrity Nbs to their networks. For example, we're now working with Deloitte to be on-hand to help their member firms select projects that align with their sustainability goals. In addition, our partnership with the DMCC - as part of their Sustainability Hub - is enabling responsible businesses in Dubai to make a tangible difference to nature.

Looking forward to 2025...

There is much to be positive about in 2025! Earthly's team and leadership are especially looking forward to:

A growing recognition of nature's importance: Biodiversity is now a mainstream topic, with global initiatives like the restoring 30% of nature by 2030 pledge and the thousands of rewilding projects happening around the world that are driving meaningful action to protect life on Earth.

Stronger laws protecting nature: Movements like Ecocide law, which seeks to criminalise environmental harm, and the Rights of Nature movement, recognising ecosystems as living entities, are today reshaping how we value and protect the natural world.

Collaboration through Article 6: Following COP29, the Paris Agreement's Article 6 is accelerating climate action by enabling carbon credit trading, creating a transparent global marketplace and building international trust and cooperation.

Carbon credits as a catalyst for change: With tools now available to robustly screen carbon credits (inc. Earthly's holistic naturebased project quality assessment), these approaches are now funding critical nature-based solutions worldwide, directing investments to high-integrity projects with measurable impact.

Innovation in biodiversity: Biodiversity-focused innovation is flourishing and at Earthly we're proud to lead the way with our Voluntary Biodiversity Credit Product, enabling businesses to fund measurable, impactful conservation efforts.
